Dear Mr. Chaffee:

This letter is in response to your email of September 26, 2016, to the Hearing Unit of the Division of Purchase and Property (Division) on behalf of the Caviart Group, LLC (Caviart). In that correspondence you state that you received a Notice of Proposal Rejection from the Division's Proposal Review Unit for failure to include the *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form. You further note that the form was submitted online through the Division's NJSTART System. The Division accepts your letter as a protest of the Notice of Proposal Rejection. With the protest letter you have submitted a completed and signed *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form.

In consideration of Caviart's protest, I have reviewed the record of this procurement, including the Bid Solicitation ({Request for Proposal} (RFP)), Caviart's proposal, relevant statutes, regulations, and case law. This review of the record has provided me with the information necessary to determine the facts of this matter and to render an informed final agency decision on the merits of the protest. I set forth herein the Division's Final Agency Decision.

By way of background, the Division's Procurement Bureau (Bureau) issued the subject RFP on behalf of the New Jersey Site Remediation Professional Licensing Board to solicit Quotes {Proposals} from qualified bidders to review, update and administer a licensure examination for individuals applying for a Site Remediation Professional License. RFP § 1.1 Purpose and Intent. The intent of the RFP "is to award a Master Blanket Purchase Order (Blanket P.O.) {Contract} to that responsible Vendor {Bidder} whose Quote {Proposal}, conforming to this Bid Solicitation {RFP} is most advantageous to the State, price and other factors considered. The State may award any and all price lines." Ibid. On September 14, 2016, the Proposal Review Unit opened proposals received by the submission deadline of 2:00 p.m. The record of this procurement reveals that Caviart's proposal was rejected for failing to sign the Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran form.

The above referenced solicitation was comprised of the RFP and other documents, one of which was the *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form which is addressed in RFP Section 4.0, *Proposal Preparation and Submission*, and states in pertinent part:

4.4.1.2 NJ STANDARD BID SOLICITATION {RFP} FORMS REQUIRED WITH THE QUOTE {PROPOSAL}

Vendor's {Bidder's} failure to complete, sign and submit the forms in Section 4.4.1.2 shall be cause to reject its Quote {Proposal} as non-responsive.

4.4.1.2.2 DISCLOSURE OF INVESTMENT ACTIVITIES IN IRAN FORM

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-58, the Vendor {Bidder} must utilize this Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran form to certify that neither the Vendor {Bidder}, nor one of its parents, subsidiaries, and/or affiliates (as defined in N.J.S.A. 52:32-56(e)(3)), is listed on the Department of the Treasury's List of Persons or Entities Engaging in Prohibited Investment Activities in Iran and that neither the Vendor {Bidder}, nor one of its parents, subsidiaries, and/or affiliates, is involved in any of the investment activities set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:32-56(f). If the Vendor {Bidder} is unable to so certify, the Vendor {Bidder} shall provide a detailed and precise description of such activities as directed on the form. A Vendor's {Bidder's} failure to submit the completed and signed form with its Quote {Proposal} will result in the rejection of the Quote {Proposal} as non-responsive and preclude the award of a Blanket P.O. {Contract} to said Vendor {Bidder}.

[Emphasis added.]

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:12-2.2, a bidder's Proposal must "contain all RFP-required certifications, forms, and attachments, completed and signed as required" or "be subject to automatic rejection." As set forth in RFP §§ 4.4.1.2 and 4.4.1.2.2, the submission of the completed and signed *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form as part of the proposal was required. There are two permissible ways through which vendors may submit the *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form:

- (1) Vendors {Bidders} using *NJSTART* to submit a Quote {Proposal} shall make the appropriate certification on the "Maintain Terms and Categories" Tab within its profile by checking the applicable box and, if required, completing and attaching the shortened Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran form; or
- (2) Vendors {Bidders} not using *NJSTART* to submit a Quote {Proposal} must complete the full Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran form located on the <u>Division's website</u>. The full version of the form is also available in <u>NJSTART (www.njstart.gov)</u>.

The record of this procurement reveals that Caviart submitted its proposal through *NJSTART* by the proposal submission date of September 14, 2016. With its submission, Caviart included a copy of the *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form, which was filled out; however, the document did not contain either a physical or typed signature. See Caviart's submitted form below.

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The requirement to certify that a bidder is not engaged in certain prohibited activities in Iran is set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:32-58. The New Jersey Legislature, in implementing N.J.S.A. 52:32-58, mandated requirements that a bidder must comply with in order to enter into a contract with the State. N.J.S.A. 52:32-58 states:

A State agency shall require a person or entity that submits a bid or proposal or otherwise proposes to enter into or renew a contract to certify, at the time the bid is submitted or contract is renewed, that the person or entity is not identified on a list created pursuant to subsection b. of section 3 of the act as a person or entity engaging in investment activities in Iran described in subsection f. of section 2 of this act.

[Emphasis added.]

In reviewing proposals submitted in response to an RFP, the Division does not have the power to waive this legislative requirement, as only the New Jersey Legislature can change a requirement it has mandated. In order to make this process of certifying easier, the Division provides to the bidding community the *Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran* form to be completed and signed in order for bidders to comply with the statutory requirements. Unless otherwise specified, forms must contain an original, physical signature, or an electronic signature pursuant to Section 1.3.4 of this Bid Solicitation {RFP}. RFP § 4.4.2 Forms, Registrations and Certifications Required Before Blanket P.O. {Contract}}

Award And That Should Be Submitted With The Quote {Proposal}. Here, unfortunately, the signature line on the submitted form was left blank. Because Caviart submitted its proposal without the Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran form being signed, it was not in compliance with the Legislative requirement that mandates that a bidder certify at the time of bid submission that it is not engaged in investment activities in Iran.

Notwithstanding Caviart's interest in competing for this procurement, to allow a bidder who did not appropriately complete, sign and submit all of the required forms with its proposal as required by the RFP to be eligible to participate in the procurement process would un-level the bidder's playing field, as the State received responsive proposals in which all necessary documents and information were provide as required. The deficiency at issue cannot be remedied after the proposal submission deadline as acceptance of Caviart's proposal under these circumstances would be contrary to the provisions of the governing statute and provide Caviart with disclamation options not available to those bidders whose proposals where fully responsive. In light of the finding set forth above, I have no choice but to deny your request for eligibility to participate in the competition for the subject contract. This is the Division's final agency decision on this matter.

This is an unfortunate situation for the State as the Division encourages competition and appreciates the time and effort put forth in preparing and submitting Caviart's proposal.
